#### **Executive Session**

19. The Council opened into executive session at 7:07 pm under Sec. 551.074 (a) (1) and/or (2) of the Texas Government Code, for discussion of Personnel Matters including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, consideration of the employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of Wayne Thompson, Chief of Police. The session ended at 8:12 pm at that point which Council opened into regular session.

- 20. Four motions arose from item #19 as follows:
  - a. Mary Condon made the motion to look at the repair of Police vehicle unit #804 until after October 1, 2025. Mike Harrell seconded the motion. None opposed. Motion carried unanimously.

  - d. Mary Condon made the motion that due to budget constraints and the advice of the City Attorney, we cannot take \$5,000 from the Chief's salary and distribute it to the other officers. Mike Harrell seconded the motion. None opposed. Motion carried unanimously.
- 21. Mary Condon made the motion to approve the first reading of 2025-20, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, TEXAS AMENDING THE CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, ZONING MAP, AND ZONING ORDINANCE, AND CHANGING THE ZONING OF CERTAIN PROPERTY AS DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR SAVINGS, REPEALING AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSES; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY CLAUSE NOT TO EXCEED \$2000 OR THE HIGHEST PENALTY AMOUNT ALLOWED BY LAW, WHICHEVER IS LESS; AND, PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE CAPTION HEREOF from Forrest Hyde to rezone from Single-Family Residential District (SF-1) to Mixed Use District (MU) WCAD Parcel R367749 also known as 102 Adams Ave., Florence, Texas 76527. - 22. Mary Condon made the motion to award the Construction Services Contract to Adams Materials and Excavation LLC in the Amount of \$238,823.50 for the TDA Street Project CDV23-0102, and for Mayor Ben Daniel to execute the contract. Mary Jane Swope seconded the motion. None opposed. Motion carried unanimously.
- 23. Mary Condon made the motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance 2025-18, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, TEXAS, ZONING FOR TRAFFIC AND RATE OF SPEED THEREIN, ON BS 195 IN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE; DEFINING SPEEDING AND FIXING A PENALTY THEREFORE; DECLARING WHAT MAY BE A SUFFICIENT COMPLAINT IN PROSECUTIONS HEREUNDER; WITH A SAVING CLAUSE REPEALING CONFLICTING LAWS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. #### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE:

SECTION 1. That the appropriations for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026, for the support of the general government of the City of Florence, Texas be fixed and determined for said terms in accordance with the expenditures shown in the City's Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget, a copy of which is appended hereto as Exhibit "A";

SECTION 2. That the Budget, as shown in words and figures in Exhibit "A", is hereby approved in all respects and adopted as the City's Budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2026.

SECTION 3. That there is hereby appropriated the amount shown in said budget necessary to provide for a sinking fund for the payment of the principal and interest and the retirement of the bonded debt requirements of Fiscal 2025-2026 of the City of Florence.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption of its second and final reading by the City Council of the City of Florence, Texas.
